NEW FINDINGS RE: TWA 800 FROM AUTHOR JACK CASHILL

Washington, DC, June 28, 2016 – On July 17, 1996, 230 passengers died on TWA's Flight 800 when it exploded and crashed just south of Long Island, NY.
